



2023 Food Vendor Requirements

- All Food service vendors are required to obtain a Provincial Environmental Health License for their product and display the same at their booth.
- Apply online: <https://www.princeedwardisland.ca/en/service/operate-a-food-premises-licence-online-application>
 - Please submit a copy of your license via email at the time of application.
 - The original document must be available for inspection on site.
 - Failure to do so will result in suspension from the market.

- Handwashing stations are required for each food vendor.

Electrical Guidelines:

- Electricity is available to vendors, with priority given to Food Vendors.
 - Request at the time of booking as the number of outlets is limited.
- If you have an issue with power onsite, you are required to alert the Market Manager immediately.
- Vendors must use, at all times, a quality **Surge Protector**.
- Vendors must use a quality, **3-prong grounded extension cord, 10' MINIMUM**.
- PROCESS –
 - 1. The Surge Protector is plugged in to the Pole
 - 2. The Extension Cord is plugged into the Surge Protector
 - Under no circumstance can an appliance be plugged directly into a pole outlet.
- Extension cords and Surge protectors must be checked to assure they are in working order prior to arriving at the Market – faulty equipment is a risk to everyone and the power source.
- Outlets are standard household 120V total per pole (not each socket) which limits the number of appliances in use at one time per booth. For example, if you can't plug a blender, hotplate, heater, and grill into one plug on our home counter, you should know you can't do the same at the Market. You must be aware of each piece of equipment and its power draw –
 - NOTE THE UNITS' VOLTS USED ON MANUFACTURES LABEL FOR EACH APPLICANCE.
 - Information about your appliance should be available online – it is up to each vendor to research their own equipment.
- **Equipment is the responsibility of the vendor.**
